 - Improve the graduation rate
 - Engage parents to meet program goals

Our Organization Focus and Programs

MEGA Mentors is a volunteer organization comprised of over **100** volunteers who support over **550** students in **eight (8)** Chesterfield County Schools. **MEGA is a nonprofit organization, and affiliated with the Chesterfield Education Foundation.** The organization was founded in the fall of 2009 when Dr. Marcus Newsome, Superintendent Chesterfield County Schools, asked a few community leaders to participate as mentors to close the achievement gap with especially African American males. Since then, the organization has grown exponentially in terms of volunteers, students and programming. MEGA now serves male and female students in its mentoring programs which teach the **basic values of RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, EFFORT and ACHIEVEMENT.** These core values are imbedded in over 75 "lesson plan guides" developed by MEGA Mentors and friends of MEGA. The "lesson guides" also include life skills and leadership training and social experiences to broaden the student's perspective personally, academically and socially. We understand that all learning does not occur in the classroom. The organization sponsors speakers from all professions. Additionally, MEGA sponsors field trips, goal oriented recognition programs and awards to encourage **ACHIEVEMENT.** MEGA participates in the Falling Creek After-School Program.

In 2015 MEGA Mentors was recognized as '**Community Partner of the Year**' by the Chesterfield County School Board and Administration. MEGA was also recognized as recipient of '**The Presidents Volunteer Service Award**' for community service. In summary, our goals are to build hope, student efficacy, goal orientation and leadership skills which will eventually lead to better scholastic and behavioral results. How Can You Help Make a Difference? Volunteer Opportunities (Times are subject to change)

- 1) Mentor a student one-on-one (as schedule permits, but at least three hours a month)
- 2) One-on-One tutoring of a student (as schedule permits, but at least three hours a month)
- 3) Guest speaker at a mentoring or life skills session (as schedule permits, 45 minutes to an hour)
- 4) Work on various organizational committees that fit your skill set (as your schedule permits)
- 5) Mentor and Life Skills Program (Minimum two hours a month during the academic year) *
 - **Carver Career and Technical Academy: Mondays, 2x per month (1 hour each session- 8 a.m.)**
 - **Meadowbrook High School: Thursdays, 2x per month (1 hour each session 8 a.m.)**
 - **Chesterfield Technical Center Hull Street Campus: Fridays, 2x per month (7:15 - 8:20 a.m.)**
 - **Carver Middle School: Tuesdays or Thursdays ,2x per month (1 hour each session)**
 - **Falling Creek Middle School: Wednesdays or Thursdays, 2x per month (1 hour each session 8.am.)**
 - **Manchester Middle School: Tuesdays, 2x per month (1 hour each session starting 8:00am)**
 - **Providence Middle School: Tuesdays or Thursdays, 2x per month (1 hour each session)**
 - **Salem Middle School: Tuesdays or Thursdays, 2x per month (1 hour each session)**



How Can You Help Financially?
